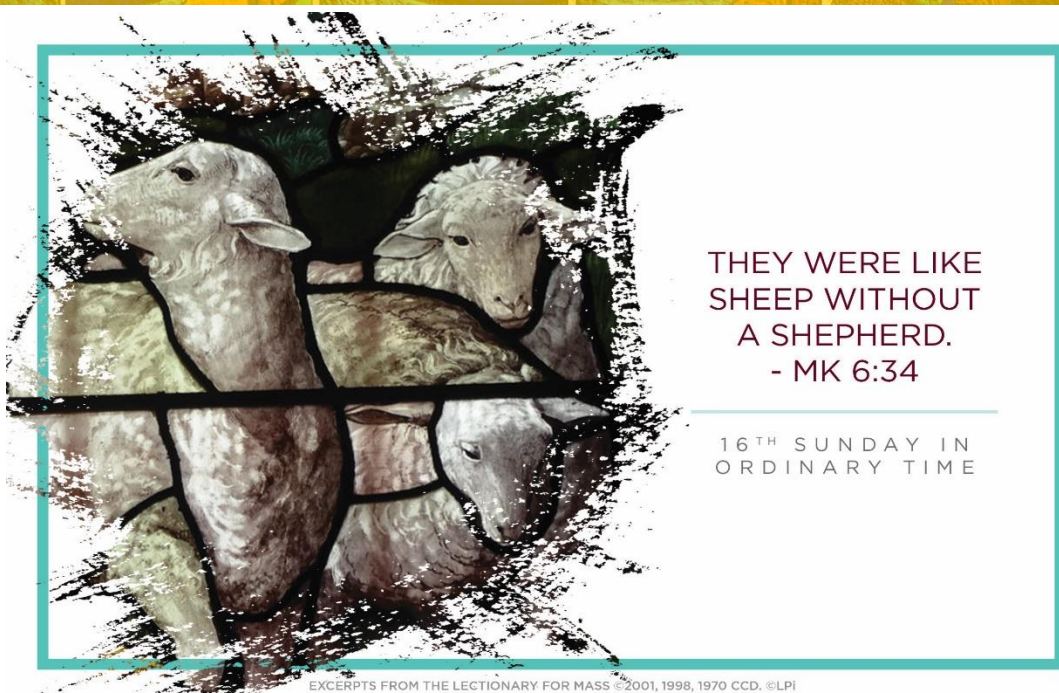

## VOICE FROM THE PEWS

I like this reading. Jesus delivers an important message for all moms and dads, especially those of us who are overcommitted, over responsible and overstressed. If we are to respond in love to the people around us rather than react out of impatience, frustration or just plain exhaustion, we need to get away once in a while. Parents need to be alone and rest, even from each other.

Married couples need to give each other the gift of time, time alone to squander with a good book, a long walk or a respite in the garden. Consider giving each other a yearly weekend off to go on retreat to regroup and reenergize. Finally, make sure you spend some time together without the youngsters.

Sometimes we get so wrapped up in being mom or dad or wage earner that we forget we are part of a couple. Parents need to treat their relationship

like precious silver—forgotten, it will tarnish, but if you spend just a little time caring for it, you have a treasure that the whole family will benefit from.

Get away once in a while. Go out for coffee. Take a walk, or have a Taco Bell-catered dinner when the kids are in bed. If you want your marriage to work, you have to take the time to work on it.

Time is precious. Like Jesus and the apostles, you know the crowds will eventually find you again.

### QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

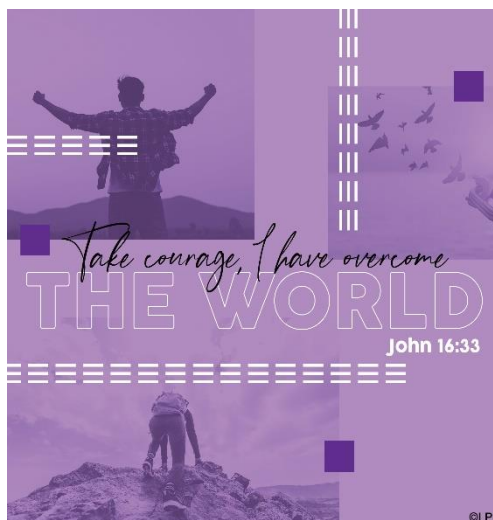

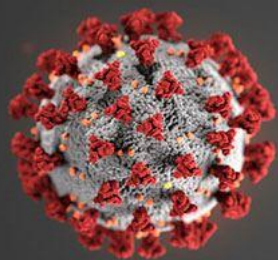

COMMENCING 9 JULY**

NSW Health has revised the COVID-19 guidelines effective Friday 9 July 2021.

Public Masses are not allowed.

Funerals are still permitted with a maximum number of 10 attendees.

NSW Health continues to mandate that face masks are to be worn at all indoor venues, including places of worship.

Weddings and other celebrations are also not allowed during this period.

Services can be livestreamed from a church. However only those involved in the liturgy and operation of equipment for the livestream event are allowed in the church.

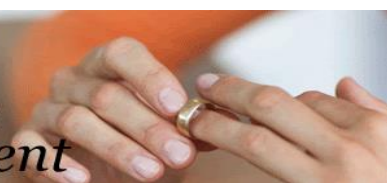
Parish Office is open Mon to Fri, 9am to 5pm.

For those involved in the livestreaming, NSW Government still requires contact tracing. There are two ways to do this:

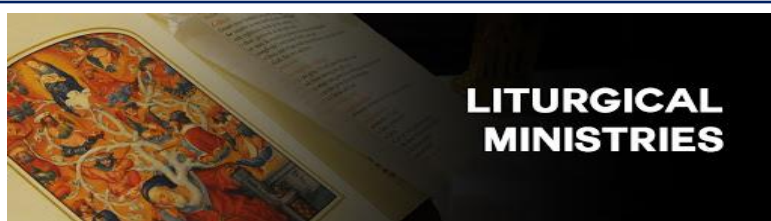
- Sign-in using the QR Code displayed near the entrance doors or

My name is Elsa Roberto. I'm from the Philippines. In 1984 we moved to St Clair from the Inner Western Suburb. I have three children and four grandchildren. My three kids were christened, confirmed, and received their first communion in Holy Spirit Parish and have attended the Holy Spirit Primary and Emmaus College.



I used to work in the field of Information Management where I experienced opposite worlds. Having worked at the Reserve Bank of Australia I saw gold bars, notes and currencies. My work in another company, Oil Search Ltd brought me to PNG and Southern Highlands where I dealt with marginalised and vulnerable groups. The land is rich in oil but poverty is rampant and I could not say that their wages are scanty because they have none. With no education and work, how do these people live?

When I retired in 2019, I felt that my service was not enough so I sought for more opportunities where I could serve the Lord in any way. I render help whoever needs it and in any other way I can, from filling up forms, helping them to meet their doctors' appointments and taking them to the hospital.

I expanded my "involvement horizon" to the greater community and beyond. I am involved in projects about health which will benefit the sick. I cannot detail the projects due to confidentiality.

I am a member of the Flower Ministry and a Eucharistic Minister and the Coordinator of the Devotional Stall which is progressing. Thanks to the help of my "partner-in-crime" Marthese Grima. I occasionally contribute to "Voice from the Pews."

## Recognize God In Your Ordinary Moments

### The Stewards Work Is Never Done

Woe to the shepherds who mislead and scatter the flock! When you hear these strong words from the Old Testament, you're probably thinking, thank goodness I don't have any sheep — dodged that bullet. Nobody misled here! No flock scattered on my watch! However, we are all shepherds of a kind, called to tend our own sheep: our families, our parishes, our communities.

But it's exhausting. Don't we all sometimes just want to take a break from being a steward? The excuses are so familiar: we're tired, we've done enough, we've given all we can, what more does the parish (or my spouse, or my kids, or my boss, or my friends, or my community) want? We give ourselves permission to be selfish. So, what if the flock scatters just a little?

Jesus gets that. We can just imagine him weary with exhaustion, can't we? We see him on his boat, attempting to sneak away for a quick break — maybe just a chance to eat a bite of food in peace. He is God, but he was still human, after all. Even the most dedicated shepherds need to sleep. But people couldn't leave him alone. They were hungry for him. They needed what he could offer, and they needed it now.

As tough as it is, that's the example we are tasked with imitating. Everyday Stewardship demands accountability. It demands our showing up even when we are tired. It demands that we look at our lives, our time, our energies, our talents, our hearts, our bank accounts and think: where do I still have more to give?

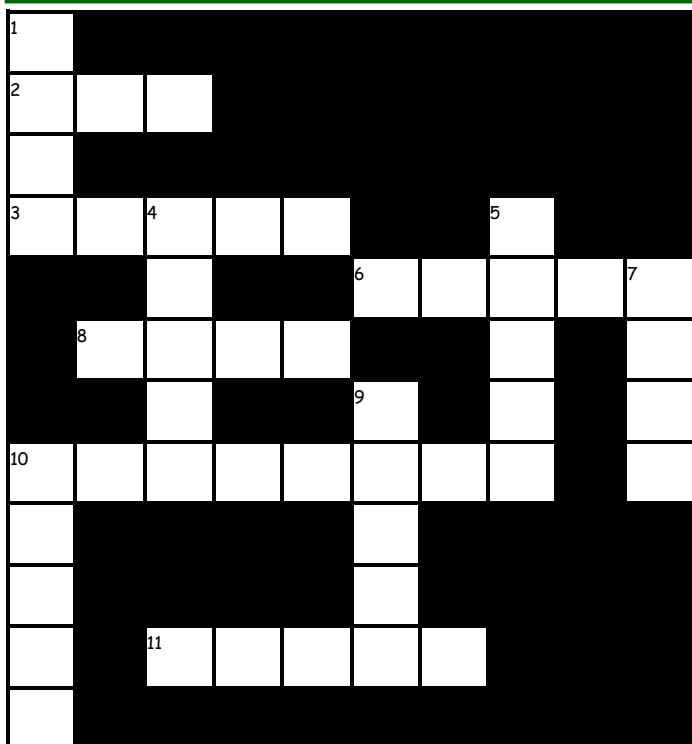

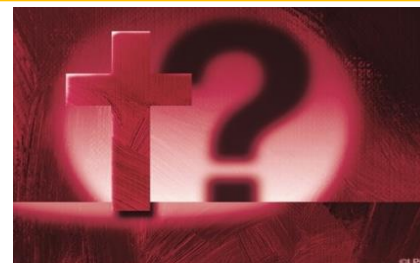

## Question:

I've heard that we become angels when we die. Is this what the Church teaches?

## Answer:

As human beings, we are both spiritual and corporeal. We are body and soul. This makes us unique in all creation. No other physical creature — plant or animal — possesses an immortal soul made in God's image and likeness. Like the distinction with plants and animals, angels have an entirely different sort of existence. Angels are pure immortal spirit, and they have been so since the moment of their creation. While they may take on an appearance of a body in Biblical history, they are not a body like we are. Angels are neither male nor female, despite the art we often see.

As the result of the Fall, human beings experience death. Our souls are temporarily separated from our bodies. However, we do not become something other than human. Every Sunday in the Creed we profess "I believe in the resurrection of the body." As Jesus was united with his body on the third day, so too will we be united with our bodies at the end of time.
